 <p><b>LARGEMOUTHS</b> R.L. Harris Reservoir</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> The winter drawdown has rearranged the habitat. Nevertheless, fish the standard black-and-blue jigs in and around the available cover along the shoreline.</p>	 <p><b>CRAPPIE</b> Weiss Lake</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> Troll 1/32-ounce jigs of various colors at different depths until you find the papermouths, which are staging alongside the slopes where deep water meets shallow.</p>	 <p><b>SPOTTED BASS</b> Holt Lake</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> Numerous techniques can fool some of the biggest spots of the year. Try a variety of lures until you get these feisty battlers patterned.</p>	 <p><b>LARGEMOUTHS</b> Weiss Lake</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> While everybody else is chasing the crappie, those folks throwing bigger baits catch bigger bass. Look for the fish on the flats and along contour breaks that have stumps.</p>	 <p><b>CRAPPIE</b> Lake Martin</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> The spawn is over for most of the papermouths, and they are now ganging up on submerged brushpiles. Either small minnows or jigs can fool these fish.</p>	 <p><b>HYBRID BASS</b> Wilson Lake</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> If you fish with live yellowtails just below Wheeler Dam, the action for hybrids can be outstanding. Also expect to hook largemouths, smallmouths, stripers and white bass.</p>

 <p><b>CHANNEL CATFISH</b> Millers Ferry Lake</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> Setting out jugs baited with crawfish is a leisurely way to target channel cats. Place the jugs on flats away from the river channel, or you may have trouble finding them later.</p>	 <p><b>CARP</b> Jordan Lake</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> Entice them up with dog food and then drop a hook baited with a kernel of corn into the feeding frenzy. The fish also take red worms or sweetened dough balls.</p>	 <p><b>CATFISH</b> Bankhead Lake</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> If you can throw a cast net, you can have a steady supply of fresh shad for bait. The flathead and blue cats in this stretch of the Warrior River will not be able to resist your offerings.</p>	 <p><b>SPECKLED TROUT</b> Perdido Pass</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> Hook a live shrimp through the horn and toss it out into the current. Trout are just one of the many fish you are apt to catch on the incoming or outgoing tides.</p>	 <p><b>STRIPED BASS</b> Smith Lake</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> Forget the hassle of using live shad for bait. This is the time to tie on a top-water lure and enjoy some explosive surface strikes.</p>	 <p><b>LARGEMOUTHS</b> Lake Guntersville</p> <p><b>Tips:</b> If we have three or more warm days in a row, find what is left of the grassbeds and pound them with lipless crankbaits or spinnerbaits.</p>
